#### Meet the 2018-2020 HSA Officers

Two nominations were received for only one position (lower school vice president), and only one for all other positions. The nominating committee decided to follow the model of the most recent SAC elections and forgo elections and create a second lower school VP office for this term.

The statements below were submitted by these candidates, who will serve as the HSA board for the 2018-2020 term.

#### Leila Graham-Willis - president

I have been an involved resident of West Philadelphia for 16 years and am the parent of a current third grader and fifth grader. I would like to be the HSA President to continue organization's strong tradition of fundraising to support activities at the school. #### Karla Thut - upper school vice president


