Perimeter Improvements - Main Pathway Entrance



An opportunity for art is envisioned at the two main campus gates on Spruce and Locust streets. Improvements to the surrounding fence may also be an opportunity to hire an artist or for temporary community installed art. Activating the main campus walk is a good way to open the perceived perimeter.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR CONNECTION

One of the things we heard most from students was a desire for more places to sit. The students have very creative ideas regarding seating. Social seating can be installed in areas where there are opportunities for social overlap: the playground, pick-up/drop-off, and adjacent to the main field.

PAVEMENT APPLICATION

Main entrance pavement can be painted or graphic decals can be applied to make the entrance clear to the community and welcome people to the site.

FENCE APPLICATION

Temporary art can be installed by students and the community. The art could be used to create words, phrases, or a mural along the fence line. Shown are hung tiles, painted bottles, ribbon, and painted pickets.





MAIN GATE APPLICATION

An artist can be hired to complete a small segment of fence or gate at each main gate on Spruce and Locust Streets. This would be a permanent art piece to mark the entrances to the site. Artists may



use a process that involves the community in the design or the physical making of the piece.

Proposed Early Action Project



Participants at May Fair voted for their favorite Early Action Project Idea by placing stickers on the Early Action boards. Kids played the board game to the right to determine which Early Action project fit their interests. Many had a hard time deciding on just one. The results were:

Creative Community Day - 41

Habitat Learning Landscape - 41

Mingle with Neighbors - 31

(however this was preferred by more current students, whereas, more adults preferred the other options)

Our recommendation is to combine elements from all 3 Early Action Projects as funding becomes available.
