SCHOOL SAFETY: A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

Keeping the children at Penn Alexander safe is our number one priority. We appreciate our families following our school procedure of entering our building through the main entrance, coming directly to the main office, and signing-in.

In accordance with School District and the City of Philadelphia, PAS has a number of safety drills through out the year to ensure our staff and students are prepared in the event a situation arises and we need to respond.

Fire Drills- On a monthly basis, as required by law, we hold fire drills. To date, we have held two successful drills that helped students practice leaving the building quickly and quietly.

Lockdown Drill- A lockdown drill is required when there is an intruder in the building, a hostage situation, an armed offender, and/or other life-threatening or unsafe situations. When a lockdown announcement is made, all school entry points are locked, and no one is permitted entry into or out of the building. Staff usher all students to classrooms, and lock doors. Our community will practice a lockdown procedure within the next two weeks.

Shelter-In Place Drill- A shelter-in-place drill helps prepare our community when conditions inside are more favorable than outside the building. It is generally used when a chemical release is occurring near the school, or when the school is made aware of an unsafe situation near school grounds. Staff usher students to designated location in the school building away from doors and windows. Our community will practice a lockdown procedure within the next two weeks.

Our teachers and staff carefully review these procedures with students in advance of a drill in preparation to ensure our community is equipped to respond if necessary.



OM is an opportunity for kids to have a lot of fun while improving their creativity, curiosity, and teamwork skills.


