To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together:

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Penn Alexander will:

- 1. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held in December, February, and May.
- 2. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.

Interim reports will be sent home to parents at least twice during each marking period or more frequently as needed. Middle school student interim reports will be sent home by the content specific teacher at least twice during each marking period or as frequently as needed.

3. Provide parents reasonable access to staff.

Teachers will be available to parents prior to the opening of school, during the teacher's preparation periods and at the end of the school day. Teachers will also be able to conduct telephone conferences during the teacher's preparation periods, before and after school if necessary.

4. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities.

Parents can volunteer in all classrooms by contacting the teacher to determine the most appropriate day and time. The school has a Volunteer Parent Database for teachers to contact parents who have a specific skill that the teacher can utilize in the classroom. Parents can also observe in classrooms by scheduling the day and time with the classroom teacher. The school also has a classroom parent for every class for the purpose of assisting the teacher and communicating the needs of the teacher with other parents.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Monitoring attendance.
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Monitoring amount of television my child watches.
- Volunteering in my child's classroom.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.
- Serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as the School Advisory Council

- Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need it.
- Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.
- Give to my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.
