Dear Penn Alexander Family and Friends,

We are writing this letter to update you on our plans for identifying a successor for Principal Michael Farrell. We are thankful for Ms. Megan Wapner stepping up to serve as interim principal as we worked through this transition. At this time, we are forming a site selection committee who will serve on the consultative committee to identify finalists for the position. Superintendent Hite and President Gutmann have approved the retention of a search consultant. These costs will be underwritten by Penn to assist in identifying candidates, soliciting feedback, and aiding in all phases of the recruitment process. The consultative committee will be as inclusive as we can make it and will include PFT President Jordan (or his designee), Penn Alexander faculty, representatives of the Home and School Association, the School Advisory Committee, the Spruce Hill Community Association, and Penn.

The position description will be distributed broadly, as we will seek nominations from across the City and beyond. We are fully committed to ensuring that we recruit an experienced leader who will build upon Penn Alexander School's extraordinary accomplishments. In the very near future, we will convene an open meeting to discuss next steps and to solicit your ideas. By that time, we hope to have identified a search consultant so that s/he will be able to join us for that important conversation.

The hiring decision is vested with the School District of Philadelphia and the new principal will be a School District of Philadelphia employee. The School District of Philadelphia, the University of Pennsylvania, and the Philadelphia Federation of Teachers look forward to continuing our productive partnership to help Penn Alexander reach new heights. We trust that the Penn Alexander school community will continue to enjoy your support as we all work together to ensure that all Penn Alexander students receive a first-rate education—one that propels them forward, fuels their dreams, and allows every child to reach his or her fullest potential.
