

Dear Parents:

As we start an unprecedented school year, we give thanks that Penn Alexander School (PAS) is a community of engaged families, teachers, and administrators who will strive to give our children the best experience possible — even under the most trying circumstances. We believe that if we work together as we always have, in the same spirit of thoughtfulness, cooperation, inclusion, and volunteerism, we can continue to provide our children the best education possible — one that has earned our school a prestigious National Blue Ribbon award and recognition as the Philadelphia School District's highest-performing K-8 School.

The Home and School Association of Penn Alexander School (HSA), in planning for this upcoming school year, took into consideration how the COVID-19 pandemic has affected and will continue to influence the needs of our school and community. This evaluation includes impacts to our budget, traditional fundraising streams, and programming. At this time, it is unclear whether the HSA or the school will be able to offer the same types of in-person community events and programming as in prior years. We are actively brainstorming ways to re-invent traditional events so that we can unite as a community virtually and safely.

We are sensitive to how families are experiencing this pandemic, especially the financial and emotional toll on many, and have decided not to embark on a traditional fundraising campaign with a set goal this year.

With that said, we fell short of our fundraising goal last year by \$76,000 because we were unable to hold two of our largest event fundraisers, the 5K Race and Art Celebration, and are not certain we can put those events on this school year. We welcome donations from our PAS families that are able to help us meet our ongoing budgetary needs of:

- Subsidizing PAS' full-time art teacher position
- Promoting school spirit and community involvement through special events
- Supporting teachers and staff by helping meet classroom needs and reimbursing them for classroom supplies
- Providing after-school clubs and extracurricular programs

We have largely been able to provide the above-mentioned programs and support because of donations from our families. As in prior years, we are requesting that families who are able to contribute a suggested \$100 per PAS student so that we can meet our ongoing budgetary obligations, continue to support our teachers and staff more than ever, and fund creative programs and events this school year. We ask all families to give what they can, understanding

that not everyone is able to give at all times. In past years, individual donations have ranged from \$10 to \$6,000. Every donation of time and money counts.

We have started a COVID-19 relief fund so that we can continue to support our families who are in need. Already, our community has worked together to support each other in so many ways and no matter what the upcoming year may look like, we know that we have a resilient and supportive school community that will become closer and stronger through this time.

We look forward to working with everyone and seeing you virtually or socially distanced. Please also let us know if you would like to be more involved with the HSA and our committees or serve as a room parent. We need volunteers now more than ever!

Thank you for your commitment to maintaining a high-quality, neighborhood public school that reflects the diversity of the city.

Home & School Association: Executive Board Elections – nominations due Sept. 9

Every two years, the parents and guardians of Penn Alexander School elect a new Home & School Association (HSA) Executive Board. The 2020 elections, originally planned for the spring, were postponed during the school closure, and will be happening in September.

If you are interested in serving on the board of the HSA or if you know someone who would be perfect for one of the jobs, **please nominate yourself or that person**.

Term: The new board will take office on October 1, 2020, and serve a two-year term (for the 2020–2021 and 2021–2022 school years) - until June 30, 2022.

Eligibility: All officers must be the parent/guardian of a child currently enrolled at PAS, and all officers must pass a Pennsylvania Criminal History check and a Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance.

Nomination forms: Due by Wednesday, September 9. Fill out this form.

Candidate statements: Each candidate must submit a written statement of 200 words about why they are running. These should be emailed to: <u>hsa.pennalex@gmail.com</u>. They are due by **Friday, September 11.** These statements will then be shared with PAS parents, via e-Pony, prior to the HSA meeting.

Candidate presentations: All candidates will read their statement at the September HSA General meeting, **Wednesday, September 16 at 7:00 pm**.

No campaigning: The HSA bylaws prohibit campaigning of any kind.

Voting: Each **PAS family, faculty member, and staff member** can cast **one vote.** (Duplicate ballots from the same family will not be counted.) Voting will take place in September by Google Form. *Uncontested races will not be included on the ballot.*

Winners: Will be announced in late September.


Dell Chromebooks

- If you have a school district issued Dell Chromebook, your student can log in at the main login window with their STUDENT ID # and password. If you still need username or password support, please call the school at 215-400-7760
- Students who sign into their school chromebook are also automatically signed into their Infinite Campus account, as well as their school Google account used for joining Google Classroom and Google Meet sessions with teachers. From the student MESSAGE CENTER, you can find links to Google Classroom and other school resources.
- If your student's teacher is using some other classroom management system Like SeeSaw or Class Dojo, your student might need to sign into those products using an ID, username or class code provided by your teacher.
- If your student is being asked to join a virtual class session using the Zoom app, you might need to add the app to your chromebook by following the steps here https://drive.google.com/file/d/1j9bAF3F41X4WHDIiCNMPtk3w4ikDGju1/view?usp=sharing
- If you are experiencing any issues with home wifi connectivity, where you sometimes lose your connection, and the chromebook does not automatically rejoin your preferred home network, try the steps found here -



If you are using an Apple iPad or other tablet

- Students using an iPad or other tablet will need to log in to Google products or the philasd.org website using their school district ID and password.
- If your student is using an iPad or other tablet, you might be able to visit some class content using a web browser, but in order that students are able to access all of their class content, some apps might need to be installed so that links or assignments posted to Google Classroom will work properly
- Apps required for school activities can usually be found in the App Store or Google Play store depending on your device see some examples below



For Google Play Store, you can also find apps that might be required by your teacher.



If you are sharing a device with someone else at home

- For students who are using a laptop or device that might also be used by others please be aware of which online accounts you are using
 - If a student is attempting to access a document that was shared by a teacher or classmate and is needed for an assignment, take note of which Google account is active when a link is clicked or a document is accessed. (A Google file might be placed into the wrong user's Google Drive, or access might be denied if the correct user is not signed in)
