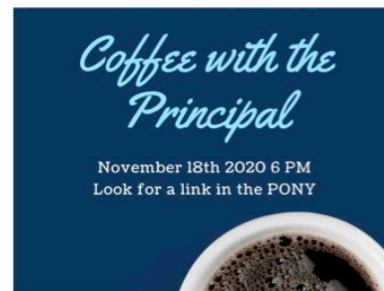

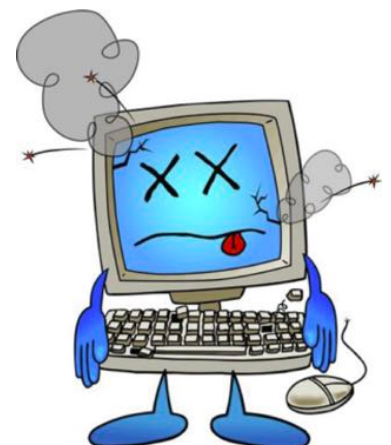

From Alumna to Alumna -- Mentorship Changed Her Life



Ashley Vines (Viola, PYO '12)

Music led to a life-altering encounter for Ashley Vines when she was only an eighth grader and attended Musicopia as an orchestra student. That's when she met Nina Wilkinson. Ashley describes her first impression of that encounter and said, "I had never seen someone who looked like me, since we're both African Americans, who had such a strong interest in classical music. While she was so much more experienced than I, our similarities changed the course of my life." Nina immediately saw

Ashley's talent and potential and encouraged her to switch to viola.

She then became her private instructor. As an alumna of the Philadelphia Youth Orchestra in the PYO Music Institute, Nina also arranged for Ashley to receive a scholarship so she, too, could thrive on the education and opportunities provided by the Institute. Ashley became a member of two of ensembles – Philadelphia Young Artists Orchestra and Philadelphia Youth Orchestra.

Ashley continues, "I never thought I'd major in music. But, after meeting Nina, I felt like I had a place in this art form." Nina was with Ashley every step of the

Marian Anderson Grant to cover the lesson costs; and, she stood by Ashley as she earned her degree from Temple University. Ashley comments, “Nina was a support system for me through all these years. She helped with my auditions, encouraged me, attended every concert.”

Nina finds tremendous personal gratification in their relationship. She has remained a constant in Ashley's life, guiding her into the PYO Music Institute, and, now into a successful career in music education. She is pleased to serve as a role model, demonstrating that people of color can have a career in classical music. Nina shared her experience, “The first time I went to the Philadelphia Orchestra I was mesmerized—but I didn't see any Black people. I didn't let that stop me. Music was in every

part of our lives; my dad listened to opera, my older brother and sister danced to the music of Jackie Wilson and James Brown, we played jazz. As an African American, music is music, no matter what color you are. You have to study and know how to play, whether it's Brahms or Michael Jackson. That is how I learned, that is how I taught. I gave my best.”

As Ashley pursued her Certification for Music Education from Temple, she worked in the PYO Music Institute—a job that Nina helped her find. At the time, Nina was nearing retirement and began working on a plan of her own: “I always knew I wanted Ashley to take my spot—working for the School District, teaching music to kids from all parts of Philadelphia—it was magical.” And, it happened this year – Ashley began teaching violin, viola, cello, and bass in the School District of Philadelphia. When asked about the new job, Ashley acknowledges that Nina is still there for her: “Even though she's not my teacher, Nina has been mentoring me in this new position. She never stops teaching me. It's really a gift to have this lifelong mentor...I wouldn't be here if it were not for her.”

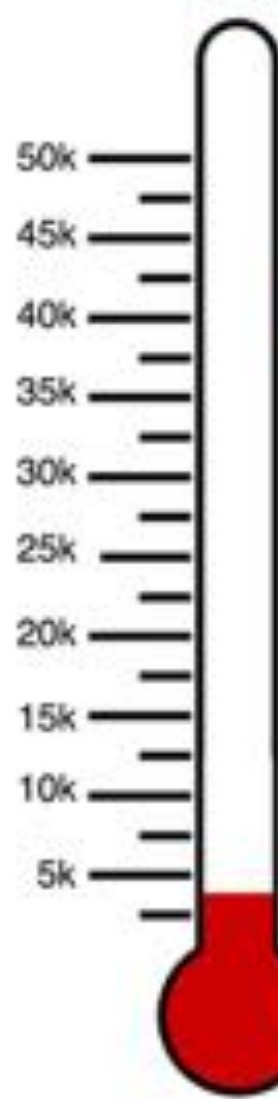

CONNECTING PHILADELPHIA K-12 FAMILIES WITH INTERNET FOR DIGITAL LEARNING

Does your family need home internet access? Do you only have access to the web through a mobile phone?

PHLConnectED may be able to help your household get the internet access it needs so your K-12 student can connect and learn.

What is PHLConnectED?

PHLConnectED is the City's initiative to help K-12 families get access to a reliable, high-speed internet connection.

Eligible students and families will be able to sign up for up to 2 years of Internet Essentials from Comcast service at no cost to them, or based on need, have access to a free T-Mobile hotspot until June 2022.

Who can get connected through PHLConnectED?

Students and families who do not currently have any broadband (wireline/in-home) internet access or only have internet access through their mobile phone may qualify for home internet through Internet Essentials from Comcast.

Students and families who are experiencing homelessness or are in-between housing may qualify for a cellular hotspot device.

How to Connect

If you would like to learn more about PHLConnectED and find out if you're eligible, **dial 2-1-1 and choose option 1**. The hotline is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and is available in over 150 languages.

যোগ্য শিক্ষার্থী এবং পরিবারগুলি বিনা ব্যয়ে কমকাস্ট পরিষেবা থেকে 2 বছরের ইন্টারনেট সুবিধার জন্য নিজেদের সাইন-আপ করতে পারেন, অথবা বিনা ব্যয়ে বা প্রয়োজনের ভিত্তিতে, ২০২২ সালের জুন অবধি একটি বিনামূল্যে T-মোবাইল হটস্পটের সুবিধা পেতে পারেন।

কারা PHL সংযুক্তED এর মাধ্যমে সংযুক্ত হতে পারেন?

PHLConnectED هي مبادرة المدينة لمساعدة عوائل الطلاب من مرحلة الروضة وحتى الصف 12 في الحصول على اتصالٍ موثوقٍ بالإنترنت عالي السرعة.

سيتمكن المؤهلون من الطلاب والعائلات من التسجيل لمدة تصل إلى عامين في خدمة *Internet Essentials* من *Comcast* دون ترتب أي تكلفة عليهم، أو قد يمكنهم الوصول إلى نقطة اتصال *T-Mobile* مجانية بناءً على الحاجة حتى يونيو 2022.

من يستطيع الإتصال عبر *PHLConnectED*؟

قد تتأهل الأسر والطلاب الذين ليس لديهم حالياً أي اتصال بالإنترنت واسع النطاق (سلكي / في المنزل) أو ممن ينحصر اتصالهم بالإنترنت على هواتفهم المحمولة للحصول على الإنترنت المنزلي من خلال *Internet Essentials* من *Comcast*.

قد تتأهل الأسر والطلاب الذين يعانون من التشرد أو الذين ينتقلون بين المساكن للحصول على جهاز نقطة اتصال خلوية.

Acceso a Internet de las familias de K-12 para el aprendizaje digital

Es posible que PHLConnectED pueda ayudar a que su familia tenga acceso a Internet para que el estudiante de K-12 pueda conectarse y aprender.

¿Qué es PHLConnectED?

PHLConnectED es la iniciativa de la Ciudad para ayudar a las familias de K-12 a recibir un servicio de Internet seguro y de alta velocidad.

Las familias y estudiantes elegibles podrán inscribirse por hasta 2 años en el programa Internet Essentials de Comcast sin costo alguno, o, según sea necesario, recibir un punto de acceso móvil hasta junio de 2020.

¿Quién puede conectarse a través de PHLConnectED?

Los estudiantes y las familias que actualmente no tienen acceso a Internet de banda ancha (alámbrico/en el hogar) o que solo tienen acceso a Internet a través de su teléfono móvil pueden calificar para tener Internet en el hogar a través del programa Internet Essentials de Comcast.

Los estudiantes y las familias que no tienen hogar o que experimentan inseguridad de vivienda pueden calificar para un dispositivo de punto de acceso celular.
