Ms. Sarah Chavez (Ms. C or Ms. Sarah)



The name Ms.C or Ms. Sarah may be one you have heard before as Ms. Sarah Chavez began her two year tenure at PAS during Ms. Durant's maternity leave in the 19/20 school year. Little did she know how valuable that time to meet students, and build relationships would be as she transitioned to leading art during the pandemic. Aside from joy emanating from her during discussions, her transparency with students about the fact they are all learning together has bore witness to students willingness and energy around helping one another, and their openness to create in different ways.

Ms. C loves working with young people, creating and building with them, intentionally creating a safe, inclusive and empowering place for the to stretch their wings and connect with various forms of expression and their voice. Although her thinking about how art is taught has been challenged, she felt that stepping outside of unified projects has created a space for students to bring themselves into their art in a beautiful, and exciting way. Ms. C shared a variety of examples of students "coming through" and showing their ability to be adaptable with the times. One



might think materials would be a major barrier in remote and hybrid art, however Ms. Sarah has explored fundamentals like form, color, shape and lines within lego, or block sculptures in second grade or the element of space within digital art, photography, painting. Meeting the student's where they are, she uses elements of art as their guiding lights and materials that each student has access to as their landscape for exploration.



Art to some is like a hidden treasure that is not always easy to connect with personally. One of the beautiful things about art at PAS, and art with Ms. C, is it surrounds us in chalk drawings, personal creations with paper, household items, paintings, murals, and anything student's heads, hearts and hands create. Thank you Ms. C for helping our children unlock the magic of art. And thank you for sharing your painting, "Toya" modeled after your Grandmother Victoria Zarazua.
