K-2 Hybrid Update

As many of you know, the Philadelphia Federation of Teachers has directed teachers serving K-2 students to remain home on Monday, February 8. The district responded that teachers would be disciplined if they do not report. The principals union is standing in solidarity with the teachers acknowledging the environmental challenges and lack of access to vaccines for educators.

Given the uncertainty, we will maintain a K-2 and specialists asynchronous

schedule on Monday. Our K-2 teachers surveyed the parents who attended conferences. Since the survey, forty PAS K-2 students have chosen to remain virtual.

Some parents were not sure, and will update us within the next week or so. This means we will likely be serving one hundred and eleven students. If your K-2 child attends a daycare, access center or in-person pod, please check with them about their rules for attending in-person at PAS while attending their center. If you plan to opt-out of the hybrid model, please let your classroom teacher or email Ann Kreidle at kreidlea@upenn.edu so we can continue to plan accordingly. What is the PHL City ID?

The PHL City ID is an optional, valid, government-issued identification card that is accepted by all City services and City-funded programs.



Who can get a PHL City ID?

The PHL City ID is for anyone who lives in Philadelphia and is age 13 or older.

How do I get a PHL City ID?

Anyone applying for a PHL City ID must provide Proof of Identity and Proof of Address. All documents must be originals and current. Some expired forms of ID may be accepted.

Examples of accepted Proof of Identity Documents:

- U.S. or foreign passport
- Veteran identification card
- SEPTA Key senior ID card
- U.S. or foreign driver's license
- High school or college student ID card
- Consular identification card (CID)

Examples of accepted Proof of Address Documents:

- Utility bill
- Bank statement
- Current lease
- Paystub
- Letter from hospital, health clinic, shelter or social service agency

How much does it cost to get a PHL City ID?

- \$5 for youth age 13-17
- \$10 for adults age 18-64
- Free for adults 65 and older

What can I use my PHL City ID card for?

Use your card:

- To open a bank account at participating banks and credit unions.
- To access health services.
- To check out library books.
- To sign in to schools and City buildings.
- To get discounts at select museums, entertainment venues, and more.
