





Penn Alexander Elementary School 2023-2024 Kindergarten Registration Process

The following are the guidelines and timelines that will govern how the application and selection process will be conducted to register students to the Kindergarten classrooms of the Penn Alexander Elementary School (PAS) for the 2023-2024 school year. All applications must be submitted through the online registration system (OLR).

Registration dates	Tuesday, January 17, 2023 to Friday, February 3, 2023
School staff sends final list to OSEP via email.	Monday, February 6, 2023
School District verifies applications	February 6, 2023 – February 10, 2023
Lottery letters mailed to students homes:	Friday, February 17, 2023

General Guidelines

- Only children who reside within the PAS Catchment are eligible for the lottery. All applications received after the
 close of the Kindergarten registration period will be placed on a wait list and will not be considered in the lottery
 process. Applications will be assigned to the waitlist in the order that they are received beginning with the first
 number after the lottery assigned students. Applications are considered complete once it has been marked complete by
 the school secretary.
- Two documents confirming residency within the catchment are required upon submission of the registration materials with one document being a Deed, a notarized lease, utility bill or government issued information. Water Bills, Residency affidavits and Delegations of Parental Responsibility will NOT be accepted. All information including immunizations MUST be submitted for consideration. Information. All applications that meet the residency requirements will be placed in a lottery.
- This notice will be reviewed annually and placed on the School District website when the School District announces Kindergarten registration on or before Friday, January 6th. All notices will be translated into the District's eight major languages.
- All registration forms must be submitted to PAS on or before the deadline. The system will no longer take applications at 11:59pm on Friday, February 3, 2023.
- All enrollment decisions will only be communicated in writing via email to the email address used in completing the application. Enrollment decisions will not be communicated over the telephone nor will letters be given to parents by the Penn Alexander School or the Office of Student Enrollment and Placement.


Follow Your Child's Star Assessment Progress with a Home Connect Account



<u>Update on SAC Action items: Traffic Safety & SAC FAQs</u> *Traffic Safety – Action Plan*

- Immediate Action: Target deployment before end of 2022
 - Draft of one page Drop off policy with School Map Draft created. Prior to finalizing, need to:
 - Survey parents at drop off to better understand needs
 - Determine if signage can be used in drop off areas
 - Understand benefit of dropping off students in bus zone areas to create "unloading" areas or to let cars that need to park.
 - Connect with PIC to better understand drop off parking and safety issues on 42nd st.
 - Notify PPA to ticket first few week of deployment
 - Wait for formal policy before messaging to families, or start messaging now?
 - Support is needed from staff and/or volunteers to enact dropoff management.
 - Penn Police has offered robotic messenger to use on street. Rebecca to contact head of Penn Police.
 - o Communicate w/families via room parents Liz to contact Christine Hill-Kayser
- Long Term Safety Action Plan: Apply for Neighborhood Slow Zone program through the City of Philadelphia (1-5 year process)
 - Spruce Hill Community Association collaborates with PAS & Parent Infant Center.
 Make formal request from the Streets Department initiated by a strong letter of support from Council member Gauthier.
 - Gauthier will need a strong showing of neighborhood support which would include:
 - letter of support from Spruce Hill Community Association (most important piece)
 - letter of support from the Parent-Infant Center
 - letter of support from SAC of Penn Alexander
 - a petition signed by parents of students
 - a petition signed by neighbors who live on or adjacent to 43rd St (if possible; CVS and several large landlords may not engage with Penn Alexander) a petition signed by those stakeholders
- The SAC will identify a pro bono traffic engineer in the community to draft/stamp engineering plans for the traffic calming measures. Without this, Streets Department will slow walk the implementation because of very scarce resources. Best to get engineering mock-ups in front of the Streets Department early while the traffic study is underway because they'll tell you all the stuff they don't want to do and you can work from there.


