

The School District of Philadelphia is requiring the students listed below to return their Chromebook & charger on <u>Monday</u>, <u>June 5</u> to our computer science teacher, Ms. Gilday. They will be stored for the summer at school. We will continue to work with the district to modify this directive, which further exacerbates the digital divide but until it is changed we will need to collect Chromebooks from the following students on Monday, June 5:

- K-7th grade students returning to PAS next year
- K-7th grade student NOT going to district school
 - (e.g., private, charter, Archdiocesan, or suburban school or another state)
- 8th grade students NOT going to a district high school

K-7 students transferring to a district school (e.g., Masterman, GAMP or another neighborhood school should **KEEP their Chromebooks** for use at their next school placement in the fall.

8th graders going to a School District of Philadelphia high school should KEEP their Chromebook for use in high school next year.

For any students who have lost or misplaced their Chromebook chargers, please keep in mind that we do not receive new chargers from the School District, so we do not have any extras. They are an easy purchase on Amazon, for example - most chargers are the USB-C, 65w, Dell compatible chargers:

Neurodiversity Day Initiative Update

- Meeting with parents, faculty, and staff held in late February to talk about an agenda for Neurodiversity Day
 - Draft presentation created during the meeting
- Presentation will be at Coffee w/Principal on Wednesday, 3/29 @8:45am
- There will be a call to action for those who may want to connect with other families (via Google form)

Principal Report, Open Forum

- We are officially in the midst of budget season!
 - Budget projections have been & will be shared at Coffee w/Principal (CwP)
 - <u>ARPA funds</u> (COVID funds) have been cut in half. This was how we funded our Asst. principal and our intervention specialist
 - Next year, there will be NO ARPA funds (that's city-wide). We will be -100k next year
 - Intervention specialist position to be cut
 - We will, through Penn Partnership, replace position with a tutoring partnership.
 - SDP tutoring: only offers virtual group sessions; we want 1:1 support
 - Academic clubs will continue to provide support. We will continue to have intervention support through Ms. Umberger & Ms. Trusty
 - HSA funding is critical to fill in the gaps & maintain status quo of the school
 - We cannot afford a new teacher: SDP formula is highest paid teacher salary plus benefits = the "cost" of a teacher = 136k per teacher. This salary is not representative of most teachers
 - 6 positions at PAS exist due to Penn Partnership
 - We spend less per kid here because we are "high achieving". Average here is 14k per kid vs 16k per kid citywide
 - i.e. Lea has 150 fewer kids than us, but more \$ in their budget in Title 1 funding – funding for student need
- We will need parent advocacy next year for more funds. What can the school community do?
 - Best way to make change here is through the interest convergence of multiple school communities

- Schools need more counselors and social workers, paid out of operating budget, not auxiliary funds
- Attend/observe <u>School Board meetings</u>
 - Next SDP Budget Hearing is on 4/20/23
 - When does SDP go to City Council?
 - SDP is changing to a regional model, there will be restructuring in the next year
- Mayoral race this year effectively decided this May (Democratic primary election: 5/16/23) Remember, superintendent is appointed by mayor – we could have new superintendent
- Ask mayor candidates: where do they stand on funding? What will you do for our school community, including funding, facilities, maintenance?
 - Can we make talking points for ePony?
- We need parents to fill out the district's curriculum feedback form: ELA or Math
 - When parents provide feedback on their school's curriculum, SDP will cut some of the costs
 - We can connect re: survey through room parents. Overton to craft email for room parents
- Parent Surveys are coming up!
 - We need greater than 75% participation! Currently we are at 50%.
 - PAS receives points from the district for survey completion
 - While there's already a lot of family participation at PAS, we will ONLY get points based on completing the survey!!
 - Points from the district give us a district-wide rating, including a building score, which is used for the budget
 - It is a critical opportunity for families to give the school feedback. We can break down the survey demographically to create concrete benefits in the school community & environment.
 - It helps us to make things visible that are not visible
 - It helps us to teach our teachers, so we know what your experience is and we can be responsive to that experience
 - Family surveys are due by the end of the year.
 - Overton will be at family conferences to get people to do them in person
 - What are other opportunities to get people to do it?
 - Paper printout to go home w/kids; email sent via room parents; ePony; computers stationed at packet pickup for 5k, musical, spaghetti dinner





Dear Parent,

I want to extend an invitation for your child to apply to join "*Physics Wonder Girls*" - a free fourday Physics Summer Day Camp for Middle School Girls to be held on the University City campus* of Saint Joseph's University (SJU). The physics camp, on its tenth successful year, is free and is made possible by sponsors including Constellation and Puratos Corporation. Students nominated by their science teacher can apply to participate in one of two camps: Camp A (June 26-29, 2023) and Camp B (July 10-13, 2023). The physics camp aims to *sustain interest of middle school girls in science through hands-on physics demonstrations and activities promoting physics and engineering as disciplines*. The camp will culminate in a capstone activity in the form of a Physics Community Showcase by the participants and to be attended by family, friends, and organizers on the last day. The camp is organized by myself (Prof. Roberto Ramos) and a small crew of university students. Applicants must be full-time, rising 8th or 9th grade female students from schools in the Greater Philadelphia-South Jersey Area. To be considered, <u>applicants must complete the online application</u> form and upload a **Personal Essay** no longer than 500 words addressing the question "**Why I am interested in Physics !**". Parents or guardians must upload completed and signed waiver and Emergency Contact information forms. 
